
AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE CELL

Dr. Ambedkar College, Deeksha Bhoomi has adopted a zero-tolerance attitude towards ragging and prohibits any and all ragging on its campus. Students are alerted to ensure a ragging-free environment on campus. Through various awareness programme, it is been conveyed to the students that, any student found guilty of committing or abetting in any form of ragging shall face strict disciplinary action.

All students enrolled at the college must follow the procedure below as an undertaking to said policy:

- Students must visit website and download the Anti-Ragging Affidavit (Undertaking).
- Parents & Students should fill up the affidavit with relevant and up-to-date information.

RAGGING MEANING:

As per the Supreme Court of India, "Ragging is any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness to any student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student." Further, the UGC hasnotified via the 3rd amendment in UGC Regulations on 29th June 2016 to expand the definition of ragging by including the following:

"Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at

another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background."

LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK FOR ANTI RAGGING:

Prevention and prohibition of ragging in institutions imparting higher education in the country is a great concern of all authorities including the law enforcing agencies. Regulations have been framed by various apex bodies of higher education in the country in order to root out ragging in all its forms in the Universities and its affiliated colleges across the country. In this context, the Report submitted by the Raghavan Committee constituted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP No.24295/2006 is relevant. Hon'ble Supreme Court of India accepted the various recommendations made by the Raghavan Committee and made it mandatory for the concerned to implement the following recommendations.

- The punishment must be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of suchincidents and exhibits the zero tolerance against the act of ragging.
- Every single incident of ragging where the victim or his parent/guardian or the Head of Institution is not satisfied with the institutional arrangement for action, a First Information Report (FIR) must be filled without exception by the nstitutional authorities with the local police authorities. Any failure on the part of the institutional authority, or negligence, or deliberate delay in lodging the FIR with the local police shall be construed to be an act of culpable negligence on the part of the authorities by the Courts. All efforts should bemade to ensure that cases involving ragging are taken up on priority basis to send the message that ragging is not only to be discouraged but also to be dealt with sternness.

At present, we are governed by Maharashtra Anti Ragging Act, 1999 and UGC guidlines-for-councils-universities-and-colleges-for-curbing-the-menace-of-ragging. All the students, teachers and parents are requested to go through these legislation and regulation and strictly abide by the rules prescribed thereunder.

Hence, it is emphasized that ragging of and among students of this college in any form at any place will not be tolerated, and it is banned. For this purpose, the following activities and / or actions shall be construed as the forms of ragging.

- 1. Ragging has several aspects among others, psychological, social, political, economic, cultural, and academicdimensions.
- 2. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect ofteasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other students.
- 3. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students, which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm, or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher orany other student.
- 4. Asking any student to do any act, which a student is not comfortable or has the effect of causing or generating sense of shame or torment or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche on such fresher or any other student.
- 5. Any act that prevents disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student.
- 6. Exploiting the services of a junior student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or agroup of seniors.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student by senior students.
- 8. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults and stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of the student.
- 9. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, snail-mails, blogs, public insults, including deriving pervertedpleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to others.
- 10. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of students.
- 11. The human rights perspective of ragging which involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to humandignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicideby the victims.

The contact details of the members of this committee can be found on the University website. This is also displayed at conspicuous places in the college campus, almost in all the departments. A student or parent can also write to spkalamdhad@gmil.com in case of any difficulty. If the Committee finds the merit in the case of ragging on the complaint received, the Committee will take immediate action including the filing of First InformationReport (FIR) with the local police depending on the seriousness of the case.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the off ence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the University, the possible punishments (one or a combination of more than one) for those found guilty of ragging at the College level is as follows:

- 1. Cancellation of admission.
- 2. Suspension from attending classes.
- 3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- 4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
 Withholding results
- 5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- 6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- 7. Rustication from the University for a period as may be determined by appropriate authority.
- 8. Expulsion from the University and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution of the University.
- 9. Fine of Rupees 25,OOO/-
- 10. Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

As a preventive measure, all the existing and newly admitted students and their parents/guardians shall submit an undertaking in the prescribed form in the beginning of the academic session itself, failing which the concerned student will not be allowed to attend classes until he/she and his/her parents/guardians submit the said Undertaking.

This is a sincere appeal to all the students of Dr. Ambedkar College, Deeksha Bhoomi, to abide by the instructions scrupulously to ensure a healthy academic atmosphere and help us to continue the tradition of a ragging free campus.
