CONCLUDING REMARKS

General Profile of the College - The College is a grant in aid, self-funded, co-educational college and is affiliated to RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur. It has 42 academic programmes----

The college has designed three new academic programmes, which are in the pipeline for final implementation.

The college also offers self-funded certificate programmes as well as value added programmes. There are plans to develop inter-departmental collaborative programmes as well as inter institutional collaborative programmes along with new certificate programmes.

Out of the 10 recommendations for quality enhancement by the NAAC peer team for reaccreditation, 6 recommendations are in the process of implementation.

IQAC - The College IQAC is composed of 27 members in which are included faculty members, administrative and technical staff, management representatives, external experts, community representatives, alumni and students of college.

The IQAC prepares calendar of annual activities for the college whereby various academic programmes for the development of staff and student progression is planned for the full academic year.

Co-curricular activities, interdepartmental schemes, community extension programmes, faculty and staff development programmes are chalked out for the year and the same are sought to be implemented in the academic year from July to April.

The IQAC of the college organized a NAAC sponsored 2 days seminar on value based education in the year 2011-2012 wherein 150 participants from colleges of the country participated.

The IQAC continually strives to provide inputs for quality enhancement in the college. (The details of the same are provided in point number 21).

Academic and Research Outputs - The faculty members of the college are actively involved in research projects, both major and minor.

Research paper publications of the faculty members is significant both in the national and International journals. There are approximately nine books published which are authored/co-authored by the faculty members. Participation in national and international conferences by the faculty along with paper presentation and invited talks as resource person is a strong reflection of the faculty participation in acquiring updation of their knowledge. The college has collaboration with 6 institutions- 2 international and 4 national, with international linkages. One patent has been applied for by one of the faculty member of the biochemistry department and is awaiting registration.

Student Mentoring and Support System - The College invites companies for campus placement for its students. Students are actively involved in participating in internal and external cultural events wherein they secure prizes in such events.

A big chunk of students participate in sports and games events at the university level, state level and the national level wherein most of them win the top prizes.

The college conducts about 13 sports and games event in an academic year.

Nearly 40% of the students come from the rural areas and avail of financial support in the form of scholarship.

Students are involved in social initiatives like NSS, Legal Aid and Literacy Services, Nature Club and NCC.

Student guidance and counseling is provided for career management and planning by the Placement and Career Guidance Cell which is supported by the ED cell and Unnati.

Governance and Innovation - The College has created a perspective plan for the year, which is monitored and implemented through the annual development plan.

Benchmarking is created for institutional quality management, the details for which are provided in point number 44.

The college has a Management Information Systems (MIS), which is applied to administrative procedures, financial matters, student admission and other records, student enrollment and scholarships for the economically backward classes through the College Management System.

The learning resource through E-database and E-learning process is provided in the library in addition to the conventional books and journals etc.

The department of physics has started mobilizing internal resource in the area of research and a large amount is generated through consultancy by the department of physical education.

The college regularly contributes for the improvement and development of infrastructure while significantly providing for student welfare along with staff welfare.

A grievance redressal cell for the faculty as well as students to redress grievances is in place and the same is personally supervised and tackled by the principal of the college.

The IQAC of the college conducted a SWOT analysis. (The details of which are provided in point numbers 57-60).

Finally the institution consisting of a healthy team of teaching, administrative staff and technical support staff form a unified, disciplined, sincere, hard working team of workers who are socially committed to impart quality education to the multi-disciplinary faculties of the college. The College Management is the steering force while the able and dynamic leadership of the Principal of the College contribute to the qualitative development and goal achievement of the College.
