#### NEWS FROM DEPARTMENTS

**Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology** organized UG seminars (Participative Learning Activity) on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2021 on Google meet platform in online mode to create awareness, enhance communication skills, soft skills, and presentation skills in graduate students. Seminars have also helped the students to assess themselves and improve in the areas in which they were lacking. Around 35 students attended the seminars enthusiastically and put queries before the presenters. The response was very positive. Dr.Utpal Dongre, HoD and Dr.Deovrat Begde, Assistant Professor, were the subject experts. The program was conducted by Ms.Rita Lakkakul, Assistant Professor.

All students of BSc Semester I, II, III, IV and V and VI have been mentored by teaching staff for scholastic guidance, personality development, psychological guidance, career guidance and opportunities for the session 2021-22. Approximately 102 students from B.Sc semester I and Sem II, 110 students from B.SC Sem III and IV, and 107 students from Semester V and VI were evaluated and guided by teachers of the department.

Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology along with Seeding labs of the college organised an event "Science Fair" under which two competitions were held: Quiz competition & poster competition for students from different schools and colleges on 6<sup>th</sup> March 2022. Around 68 enthusiastic students (52 participants of Quiz Competition and 17 participants of Poster Competition) from different schools and colleges in and around Nagpur participated in this event. Covid-19 guidelines were followed strictly. The event was organized in online mode.

The department organized an online Guest Lecture on The Constitution of India: Symbol of Unity in Diversity on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2021 on Zoom platform. The guest speaker for the session was Dr. Pratima Lokhande, Assistant Professor, Department of Law, DAC Nagpur. Principal, Dr. Mrs. B. A. Mehere welcomed the guest. Dr. Lokhande emphasized on aims and objectives of the Indian constitution, the working of the provisions related to the following aspects: the 'trilogy' of fundamental rights, directive principles of state policy and fundamental duties. ### **WORKSHOPS**

## **VISITS**

Students of B.Sc. **Botany** of Dr. Ambedkar College and Santaji Mahavidyalaya Nagpur jointly conducted a non-biodegradable waste cleaning activity with Plastic Eradication Drive to pay back to nature at Airport mini forest area from Khamla Bhajipatti Sq. gate to Sonegaon Lake on 29th March 2022. Plastic-leather-glass (non-biodegradable waste) in the mini forest area is unsustainable for biodiversity and ecosystem and negatively impacts soil health and floristic composition. Excessive use of plastic bags leads to choking of water bodies. Since plastic pollution is ubiquitous, it needs to be treated as a global threat similar to climate change, 27 bags of plastic-leather-glass (non-biodegradable waste) were collected and disposed to a scrap vendor near the Khamla Sq. Nagpur. This activity inspired students to safeguard natural resources and adopt sustainable practices for sustainable future. The visit was organized under the supervision of Dr. Subhash. R. Somkuwar, Head Dept. of Botany, Dr. Rahul Kamble of DACN, accompanied by Dr. Rajita Lonare and Dr. Archana Sathe Faculty of Botany Dept. of Santaji Mahavidyalaya Nagpur.

Shree. Narender Meshram, the Empanelled Designer aimed to build knowledge while re-imagining rich history of bamboo arts as a cultural practice around the villages of Maharashtra. He talked about the history of Bamboo art in Maharashtra. It was sponsored by UTI Swatnatra on the emerging topic Wealth Awareness on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2022 through zoom app. Mr. Krishnan Iyer, Certified Corporate Trainer, Business Coach and HR Consultant was the speaker. The speaker highlighted the need of simplifying investment for digitally savvy Indians and significance of wealth creation. Wealth creation plays a crucial role and helps in achieving financial goals. There is a vast difference between saving and investing which was wonderfully explained by him. Only saving is not enough, smart investing helps in creation for long term profits.

The HR cell organized the third HR lecture for teachers on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2022. The Resource Person for the lecture was Dr Suresh Chari, who is the Director Research and Medical Education Technology; a Professor of Bio-technology and a soft skills Trainer and Motivator. the topic of the talk was Interactive Triggers in Large Group Lectures. Dr Chari addressed the teachers as the key motivators for the next generation, who could actually be the game changers in the life of students. He shared some unique tips of how they could make their classrooms into the most interactive spaces where the students feel free to voice their independent thoughts and ideas. ...dialogical and not diabolical classrooms. The lecture was very interactive and interesting. Around 36 teachers attended this lecture.

HR cell in association with Department of Law organized a lecture on, Cyber Security on 25<sup>th</sup> April 2022. Mr. Sunil Sadasivan, an IT professional having more than 25 years of experience of handling IT, trainings operations, administration was the guest speaker. He is Head IT and operations with all India reporter, project director with Maharashtra Centre for skill development, director of IT and branding with percept web solutions pvt. Ltd., consultant and executor of E library Malaysian judiciary. Mr. Sunil Sadasivan uncorked the topic of, "Cyber Security" by introducing the audience to cyber issues and the threat they possess. He mentioned the sudden boom of the social networking sites as a growing concern for cyber security which puts a common person in a vulnerable situation. The session moved further with Mr. Sunil Sadasivan seamlessly explaining the security measures to be taken while using Net banking. He has explained security measures circulars and guidelines, bank account opening forms, KYC for E wallets, payment gateway, features of NET safe, mobile banking and E banking. Nearly 40 staff members attended the lecture.

Another lecture on the Importance of Organ Donation was taken up on the 26<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The resource person was Dr Ravi Wankhede who is a great activist in the field of Organ Donation. This contemporary topic was chosen for the lecture recognizing the need for for creating greater awareness in people about organ donation. Dr Ravi Wankhede began his talk by pointing out why it is important for all of us to consider donating our organs. He started by explaining the difference between organs and tissues, also pointing out why it is only organs that can be donated by us. Being himself a great activist in this field, Dr Wankhede had a treasure of real-life experiences to share with the teachers and motivate them to take steps towards thinking of engaging in this noble task. He also informed the participants of the MOHAN Foundation, which is an NGO working in this particular field. He urged the faculty members to fill the forms that contained a pledge for organ donations.

Another lecture on Fair and Swift Assessment of Students through Google Classroom was delivered by Mr Rohan Thaorey from the Bio-technology and Bio-Chemistry Department of the College on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2022. He began his presentation from the basics by focussing on the meaning of assessment and its importance in academics. Then he went on to focus on the different types of assessments like diagnostic, formative and summative assessments and pointed out how each of these are helpful in informing both students and teachers of their academic progression and for developing future strategies in respect of the same. After laying emphasis on this he turned to explaining about rubrics.
