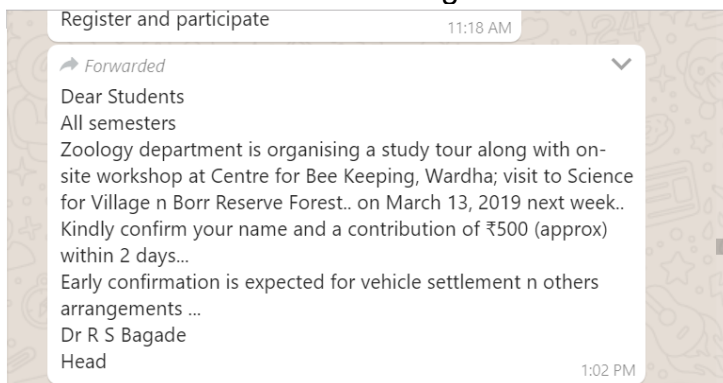

MARCH 14, 2019 BIODIVERSITY FIELD STUDY: BOR FOREST PROJECT, WARDHS
