International day for eradication of poverty is observed every year on 17<sup>th</sup> October, it was declared by the United Nations in the General Assembly on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 1992. The history behind this day was, on 17<sup>th</sup> October 1987 over a hundred thousand people gathered at the Trocadero in Paris, France to honour the victims of extreme poverty, hunger and violence. Poverty is violation of human rights and the world needs to be united to eradicate it. Since then, people from all backgrounds, social origin and beliefs started gathering there every year to respect the rights of poor.

To celebrate International day for eradication of poverty an online guest lecture and power point presentations had been organised by Department of Commerce, Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur. The guest lecture was delivered by Dr. Jyothis Satyapalan, Professor and Head, Centre for Wage Employment & Livelihoods, National Institute of Rural Development & Panchayati Raj, Hyderabad. Dr. B.A. Mehere, Principal, gave welcome address and started the session. Dr. Mrs.Varsha Panbude, Head of the Department, gave introductory remarks and gave emphasis on poverty eradication. The guest lecture was co-ordinated by Mr. Sankalp Hadke.

The title of the guest lecture was **“World Poverty and Poverty Eradication in India Issues and Challenges.”** delivered by Dr. Jyothis Satyapalan, in which he spoke briefly about (i) approaches to eradicate poverty, (ii) global trends in poverty eradication: examples from China, Korea, Argentina, Brazil, Bangladesh and (iii) the contribution of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS). In approaches to eradicate poverty he explained basic concepts of poverty and various indicators to measure poverty. While discussing the global trends in poverty eradication he explained how China, Bangladesh, Korea, Brazil, Argentina have reduced poverty but the Gini coefficient i.e. inequalities between the lower income group and higher income group is very high. At last he told the contribution of MGNREGS to eradicate poverty in which he explained how the scheme has helped for asset creation and employment generation, he also stated that the share of women in employment has increased over the last decade in few states. He concluded the lecture by stating that landless and marginal farmers needs special efforts to ensure that they get more work and increased number of days for employment.

At last, the vote of thanks was delivered by Mr. Sankalp Hadke, Faculty, Department of Commerce. He thanked the guest speaker for their precious time and guidance to students. Around 44 students participated in this guest lecture. The webinar has established a new

benchmark in understanding poverty in a multi-dimensional way. Positive feedback was received wherein students stated that they were benefited by the lecture and would like to attend more such sessions in future.

On 20-10-2021 power point presentation was conducted on Zoom Application. The main theme for this activity was **“Poverty in India: Issues & Challenges”**. Students from B.Com First Year and Second Year participated in groups. Students participated in this activity with great enthusiasm. The presenters showcase their skills by active teamwork and coordination. Dr. Varsha Panbude, Head, Department of Commerce welcomed all the participant and gave the introductory remarks. The power point presentation was coordinated by Mr. Sankalp Hadke.

B.Com First Year had presented 03 presentations and 02 presentations were presented by B.Com Second Year respectively, Total 05 presentations were made. All the groups chosen the topics from the sub themes provided to them. Sub themes were: (i) National Flagship Programs for Eradication of Poverty in India. (ii) Any State Sponsored Schemes for Eradication of Poverty. (iii) Any other topic related to reduction, eradication or elimination of Poverty. The presentation made by the participants was very insightful and relevant. Most recent data was used in there slides. Presenters explained the current national flagship programs in very precise manner. The presenters, showed that the impact of schemes like MGNREGS, PMAY, PMJDY, etc has been very effective in reducing poverty in India.

At last, Mr. Sankalp Hadke, appreciated all the participants for their efforts. Around 41 students were present in this power point presentation. The activity was a great success.

## IMPACT OF POVERTY ON SOCIETY



- ❖ Poverty is linked with negative conditions such as substandard housing, homelessness, inadequate nutrition and food insecurity, inadequate child care, lack of access to health care, unsafe neighborhoods, and under resourced schools which adversely impact our nation's children.
- ❖ Poor infrastructures, unemployment, lack of basic services and income reflect on their lack of education, malnutrition, violence at home and outside, child labor, diseases of all kinds, transmitted by the family or through the environment.
- ❖ Research shows that children who grow up in poverty are also more likely to develop chronic illnesses such as asthma or obesity – the latter can lead to further health problems, including diabetes and heart disease.
- ❖ Issues like hunger, illness, and poor sanitation are all causes and effects of poverty. Bad sanitation makes one susceptible to diseases, and hunger and lack of clean water makes one even more vulnerable to diseases.

## Self-Employment Programmes

### ❖ Rural Employment Generation Programme(REGP)

This programme was started by the government to create self employment opportunities in the rural areas and small towns. It was implemented by kadi and village industries commission.



### ❖ Prime Minister's Rozgar Yojana(PMRY)

Under this programme, the educated unemployed from low income families in rural and urban areas were given financial help to set up any kind of enterprise that generates employment.

It generates employment by stting up 7 lakh Micro enterprises during eight plan(1992-97).

In 2003-04 3 million people got employed

Under this scheme.
