

An Inaugural function and guest lecture was organized by Department of Psychology and Psycho-social counseling cell of Dr. ambedkar college, Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur on 12th December, 2021. Due to pandemic this programme was on virtual mode.

Dr. Mrs Bhoomi Mehare, Principal of the college inaugurated the programme and made introductory remarks in the beginning of the programme and offered a formal welcome to the guest and the entire participant.

Dr. Mosam Firke, Psychiatrist, Nagpur was invited as guest speaker. He talked on the topic 'Schizophrenia- Treatment and prevention'. He said that "Schizophrenia is a serious mental disorder in which people interpret reality abnormally. Schizophrenia may result in some combination of hallucinations, delusions, and extremely disordered thinking and behavior that impairs daily functioning, and can be disabling. People with schizophrenia require lifelong treatment. Early treatment may help get symptoms under control before serious complications develop and may help improve the long-term outlook.

He suggested some treatment and plan to all the participants. He also stated that there's no sure way to prevent schizophrenia, but sticking with the treatment plan can help prevent relapses or worsening of symptoms. In addition, researchers hope that learning more about risk factors for schizophrenia may lead to earlier diagnosis and treatment.
