





Dr. Varsha V Deshpande, Associate Professor taking class of first year students, introducing the students to the concepts of New Challenges in the Indian Constitutional Law




Ms. Kalyani Buche, Assistant Professor, taking class of first year students, introducing the students to various areas of Indian Constitutional Law in current times
