REPORT ON CELEBRATION OF INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY AND COMMEMORATION DAY OF SMT. SAVITRIBAI PHULE

LL.B (3years and 5 years course) and LL.M. of the Department of Law, Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi Nagpur, jointly organized a program to celebrate the International Women's Day and also observed the Commemoration Day of Smt. Savitribai Phule on 6th March 2020. As a mark of convention, the Program started by lighting the candle and by paying homage to the portraits of Lord Gautam Buddha, Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar and Smt. Savitribai Phule by Dr. N.M. Khirale and other Faculty members. It was an in house celebration, where the present faculty members shared their views and subject knowledge with respect to women's different rights.

Dr. N.M. Khirale, Associate Professor and Head, Department of law delivered a speech focusing on the role of Savitribai Phule as a social reformer and champion of women's educational rights. He highlighted the struggle she faced as a first female teacher of first Girls school and contribution of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule in supporting her education in the orthodox era of 1848. He also stressed on the contribution made by Dr. B.R.Ambedkar by introducing Hindu Code Bill and various labour related laws for women.

Dr. Pratima Lokhande, faculty member motivated the students to be an agent of social change and also highlighted the need to transform the age old mindset regarding gender equality. She motivated all the girl students to decide their life goals before they graduate from any University and College and to aspire for higher position in life.

Ms. Shilpa Rathod, another faculty member shared her views on the position of women in the field of Intellectual Property Rights and gave the example of various renowned Female Inventors who have Patents to their credit and who achieved a marvelous feat in the field of IPR.


