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A Guest Lecture on Author Versus Reader : Understanding Post Structuralist Literary Critical Trends was organised via Zoom on 30.11.2020. Prof. Sudesh Bhovate, Assistant Professor, Department of English, PWS College, Nagpur was the resource person for the guest lecture. This activity was organised under Study Cell of Better English Association. This cell arranges literary activities in the form of expert lectures for Teachers in department and Post Graduate Students. Prof. Sudesh spoke on the general aspects of criticism first and then on the particularities that included the beginning of criticism and further growth in the subject. He cited examples of writers from various genres including novelists, poets, essayists and critics to explain the topic. Concepts involved in interpretation of meaning and pleasure evolving out of the activity was also explained and discussed with suitable examples. The relationship between the writer and the reader and intervention of critics was explained along with many other current trends in criticism.

He said, new criticism takes us to the far meanings, beyond what we have been knowing till the day. And every analysis is credited to the critic only. It is the role of the literary critic that fetches significance to the text. It is the text that provides us the meanings. The entire text of any creation is a linguistic construct and there are ordinary or scientific languages that hold the meaning. A very comprehensive and enlightening explanation was also given on texts specifically selected right from Shakespeare to the modern literature and a few aspects from Dalit literature also. Definitions of Textuality, Inter-textuality and Hyper-textuality were explained quoting suitable examples from Indian and western as well as Greek sources.

Various other theoratical aspects from Ferdinand de Sassure, Noam Chomsky, Derrida, Roalnd Barthes were also discussed in detail. Dr. Shailesh Bahadure made introductory remarks in the begining of the programme and offered a formal welcome to all. The programme was competed by Ms. Anita Tirpude and a formal vote of thanks was proposed by Mr. Manoj Andraskar.
