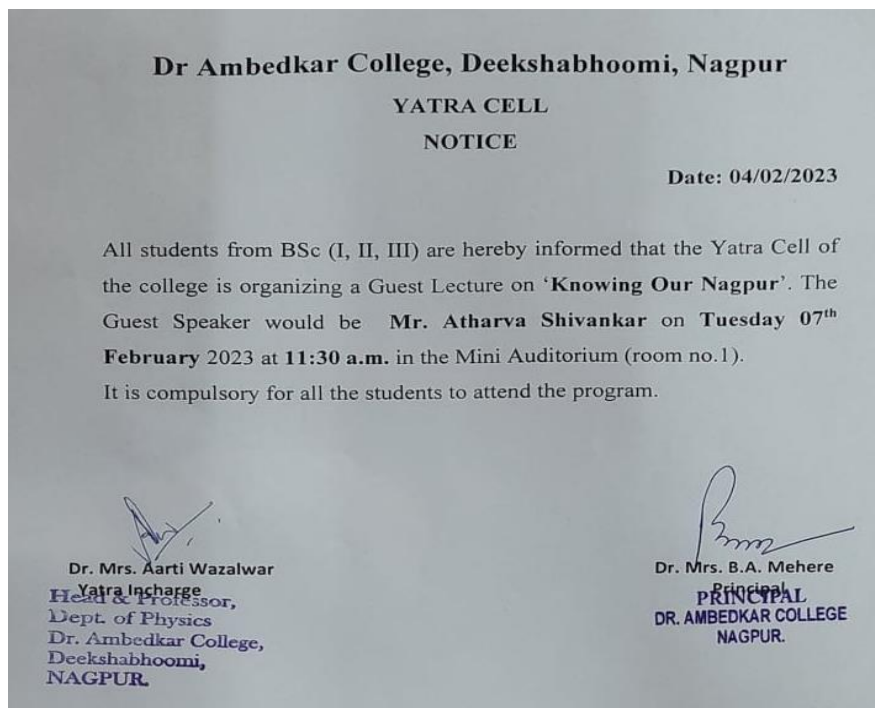
“Knowing Our Nagpur”

The Yatra cell of the Dr Ambedkar College Deekshabhoomi Nagpur organized a guest lecture under the guidance of Dr Mrs A. N. Wazalwar. On the 07th of February, Atharva Shivankar delivered a talk titled "Knowing Our Nagpur" which was attended by over 60 students from various departments of the college. This talk was a live project conducted by Atharva Shivankar, a Nagpur History Researcher who has been working in this field for the past 8 years. Atharva, His research turned fruitful when a miniature painting from Nagpur, kept in the National Library of France was brought to light. Atharva also runs a well-known Instagram page that narrates the story of Nagpur beyond the Oranges.

The program began at noon in the mini auditorium, which was packed with students from various disciplines of the college. Firstly, the host of the day Sakshi Khandare, a BSc student welcomed everyone by giving an introduction to the Program which was followed by all the

dignitaries seeking blessing from Tathagata Lord Gautam Buddha and Bharat Ratan Shri Dr B. R. Ambedkar. Further, the guest speaker was welcomed by Dr Mrs A. N. Wazalwar, Head of the Physics Department and Dr N. S. Meshram, Assistant Professor of the Physics Department and other faculty members.

A brief about the yatra cell was given by Kruti Tiwari, BSc 3rd year student and the Introduction of Atharva Shivankar was given by Shrutika Patinge, MSc 1st year student. After that Atharva Shivankar began his lecture with a PowerPoint presentation on the history of Nagpur.

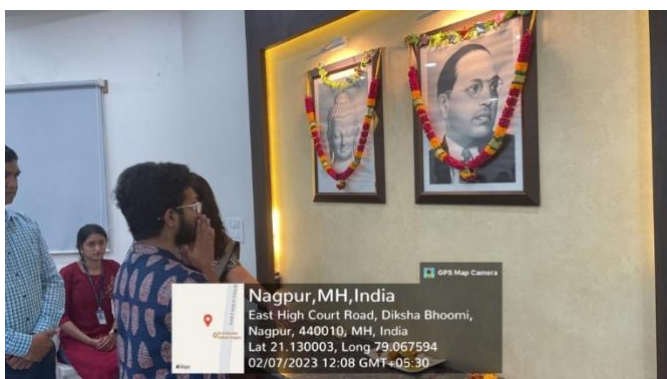
During his presentation, he shared information about the history of Nagpur as well as the various heritage and tourism sites of the city. He began his lecture according to the timeline of history initially speaking about the Gond dynasty of Deogarh was ruled in the region from 1472 to 1542 and their establishment. Following Chand Sultan's death in 1739 and succession disputes, which resulted in the throne being usurped by Wali Shah and the remaining of Gond Killa at present and the Deoli Inscription. Then speaking further his talk about A series of Maratha rulers who came to power following the fall of the Gonds from the throne of Nagpur, starting with Raghoji Bhonsle I and his armies invading Bengal region including the cession of Cuttack, Chanda, Chhattisgarh, and Sambalpur between 1745 and 1755. Further, he spoke about Raghuji II who built several temples and had idols of Vishnu, Lakshmi and Garuda ordered from Pune to be installed. Religious functions were marked by the distribution of lavish grants to the Brahmins. Nearly one lakh every year was spent on charity. Throughout the year several festivals were celebrated with pomp and pleasure. He has provided a detailed account of the Maratha Empire and the city of Nagpur during the British Raj era in the seminar room. Lastly, he showed old pictures of Nagpur like 16 January 1912 parade, Futala lake, Seetabuldee, Bakabai Wada and many more. To make the session more interactive asked students to recognize the event related to those images without mention the names beforehand.

He gave a beautiful narration of all those monuments were mentioned early, which are now a part of the rich heritage of this city. It has also been a memorable experience for all the attendees. After the session, he happily answered all the queries raised by the audience.

Lastly, the gratitude was presented by Pratham Bondre from the Physics department on behalf of all the faculty and students present on the occasion.





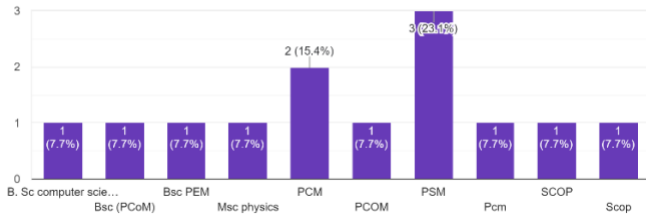

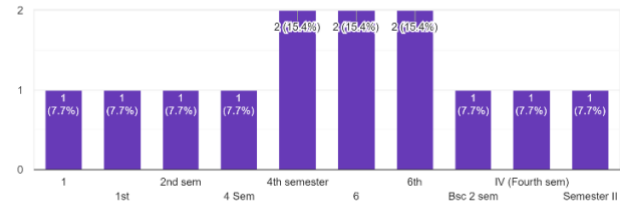

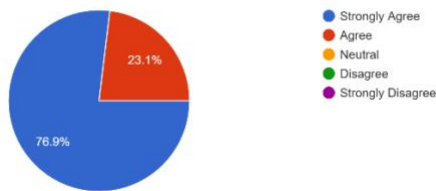

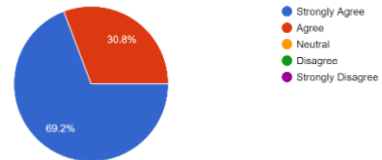

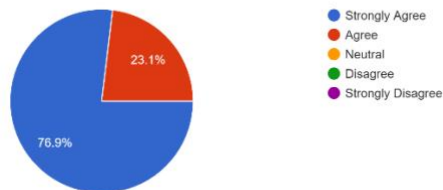

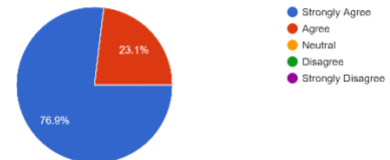

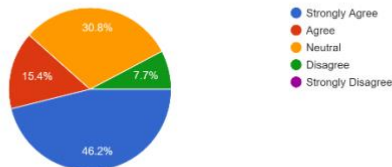
