

“A Story Telling Competition to open up vivid imaginations of unprivileged kids with Prize distribution and Refreshments”

Storytelling is the social and cultural activity of sharing stories, sometimes with improvisation, theatrics or embellishment. Every culture has its own stories or narratives, which are shared as a means of entertainment, education, cultural preservation or instilling moral values. Crucial elements of stories and storytelling include plot, character and narrative point of view. The term "storytelling" can refer specifically to oral storytelling but also broadly to techniques used in other media to unfold or disclose the narrative of a story. Stories excite the imagination: Listening to stories stimulates a child's curiosity and imagination endlessly. Fantasy is the key to exploration and creative thinking. The rich imagery in the mind inspires a child to play around with ideas and create experiences without the fear of being judged or criticized.

Stories build vocabulary: By listening to stories, children get to hear many new words. They love to hear their favorite stories over and over again, thus they become familiar with new vocabulary. A growing vocabulary will enable your child to express herself clearly and well. **Stories deal with emotions:** Stories play a crucial role in developing your child's social and emotional skills. It is far easier to talk about feelings and emotions through the characters in a story than to try and explain them to your child. Children often struggle with difficult emotions such as sadness, anger, jealousy, and frustration. Weaving these emotions into a story is a safe way to get your child to understand his own feelings and learn to regulate them, the way the characters do in the story. **Stories instill values:** What parents cannot accomplish through commands can be achieved through storytelling. Stories help a child imbibe values in an enjoyable and stress-free manner. A story with good morals remains etched in a child's memory, as opposed to lectures and advice from parents. **Short stories are engaging:** Short stories are an excellent tool to comfort children, especially when they are upset and need help to settle down. A simple narration of what is happening at the moment becomes a short story. Short stories are just enough to sustain a child's attention span as well as arouse his curiosity and imagination.

Stories always give wings to our imagination and take us to places beyond the boundaries of physical world. While competitions are the best way to boost the confidence in children. Storytelling is an art of narrating or unfolding the narratives of a story. It has been a part of our culture and tradition for centuries or we can say from many civilizations. Stories teach us about life, about ourselves, and others. Storytelling is a unique way for students to develop an

understanding, respect and appreciation for other cultures, and can promote a positive attitude to people from different lands, races and religions.

The objectives of the event were:

- To build up the confidence in the children to stand in front of the crowd and tell a story.
- To sharpen their presentation skills and to recall the sequence in a story.
- To present the story on their own with expressions.
- To develop children's imagination and stimulate curiosity.
- To enhance their creativity skill.

- To improve the speaking and listening skills of the kids.
