Student must note, according to the University rules, attendance at the Medical Examination will be compulsory for all the first year under graduate students.



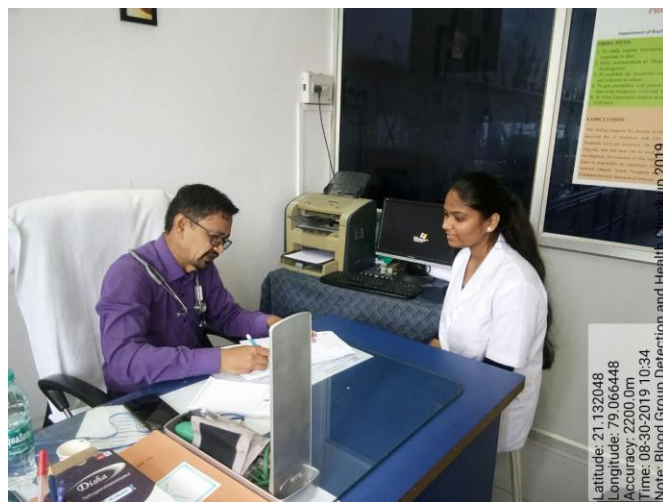

CHECK-UP CAMP
REPORT

Department of Biochemistry & Biotechnology organized a camp on “**BLOOD GROUP DETECTION AND MEDICAL HEALTH CHECK-UP**” for all students of various stream (BA, B.Com.,BCA,B.Sc. Part I) from 26th August 2019 to 04th September 2019 at the Departmental laboratory. Around 343 students participated in the camp and Dr.Vaibhav Vairagade examined the students and counseled them about their health hygiene and diet.



Medications for ailments are also provided by the department to all students free of cost. All the teaching and non teaching staff of the department enthusiastically participated in the camp.

The records were maintained for the negative blood groups which are rare and required by the blood banks. These records are also sent to the Sainath Blood Bank, Ramdaspath, Nagpur. During counseling of the students the doctor has recognized

few students who were stressed due to some personal problems. So many students from villages nearby were found to be under nourished due to unhealthy food habits. During the interaction he also analyzed that most of the students were addicted to electronic gadgets because of which they were facing different psychological problems and also losing their focus from studies.
