
#### **A Report**

Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology, Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur organized a Guest Lecture entitled, "The Constitution of India: Fundamental Rights and Duties" on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2023 at Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology. The guest speaker for the session was Mr.Rohan Thaware, Assistant Professor, Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology, DACN, Nagpur. The conference began with the welcome address by the Principal, Dr. Mrs. B. A. Mehere, Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi, anNagpur. Mr.Rohan Thaware emphasized on aims and objectives of the Indian constitution, the working of the provisions related to the following aspects: the 'trilogy' of fundamental rights, directive principles of state policy and fundamental duties; composition, structure, power, and interrelation of the Executive and Legislature; role, structure, reach and independence of Judiciary, including the evaluation of judicial activism; legislative, administrative and financial relations of Centre and States in normal time as well during emergency; and the amendment of the Constitution.

Mr.Rohan Thaware also explained how the Indian constitution has succeeded in sustaining and keeping united the world's largest and most diversified democracy rooted in constitutionalism and rule of law. He also spoke on how the Supreme Court proactively ensured that peoples' rights are protected, constitutional principles are respected and the deficits in governance are remedied. Moreover, the constitutional jurisprudence evolved over fifty-five years has also traveled to other countries. Mr.Thaware summarized that if in spite of numerous adversities and challenges the Indian Constitution has worked with reasonable success (whereas many ofits contemporaries have failed), credit must be given to the vision of Founding Fathers, its provisions, and the Indian people.

The lecture was very informative and around 30 students participated in the program enthusiastically. At the end vote of thanks was proposed by Dr.Utpal Dongre, Assistant Professor and Head Department of Biochemistry and Biotechnology. The program was conducted and compered by Prof. Rita Lakkakul.
