

Name of the programme – Study Tour, Visit to Anthropological Museum, and Swachha Bharat Abhiyan ,Seminari hills, Nagpur

The students of B.A. Sociology visited an Anthropological Museum, Seminari hills, Nagpur on 26th Sept 2019 under the in-chargeship of Prof. M.V. Khelkar, Head, Dept of Sociology of the college. The Study trip began with enthusiasm and vigour. When the students reached at the museum, incharge of museum Mr. Shukla and his team members welcomed Prof. Khelkar and his students. First of all Mr. Shukla interacted with the students asking what do you mean by Anthropology. Students answered him properly. Then he explained that what an Anthropology mean is. Then he allowed the students to observe a museum. A museum showcased a large number of pictures about evolution of human being as well as its socio-cultural development. Attempt of museum is to showcase human evolution, adaptation and bio-cultural diversity with special reference to the central region of India and its large number of ethnic groups and their rich cultural heritage. The museum has about 2300 specimens from tribes and other communities inhabiting Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Chhatisgarh and Goa along with a gallery that depicts evolution of human race through time and space.

The displays at the museum also throw a light on various activities such as hunting, gathering, fishing and agricultural operations. In addition to these we can find household activities dresses and ornaments, musical instruments, art, religion and folk arts. Interestingly, the museum also has some Palaeolithic tools and also some early remnants of fossil casting. Mr. Shukla and his companions guided the students about museum while observing the museum. Students got information and understood about evolution of human being.

A Street Play, on an importance of sanitation was performed by the students of B.A. sociology of the college in collaboration with the Employees, Anthropological museum, Seminary hills, Nagpur. A street play was performed according to 'Swachhha Bharat Abhiyan'. Mr. Shukla, Incharge of the museum, his employees and the students of subject Sociology of the college were participated in the street play. The topic of a street play was 'Plastic Free Environment'. A street play gave message not only about self-sanitation but also plastic free environment.
