

REPORT OF INDUCTION PROGRAM

(13th , 16th & 20th September 2022)

The program was conducted in the Laboratory of dept. and 38 students attended this program. The purpose of Induction Programme at DACN is to help new students to adjust in new space and feel comfortable in the new environment, to inculcate in them the ethos and culture of the institution, to help them to build bonds with other students and faculty members, to expose them to self-exploration, to make them aware of history of the institution and importance of the place where Dr. B. R. Ambedkar embraced Buddhism.

The activity was intended to motivate, encourage and energize the students for their academic and extracurricular endeavours in the department. This program also aimed at improving the awareness of students regarding scope of the subject and career opportunities the subject Statistics has to offer.

REPORT OF TOUR TO COLLEGE CAMPUS FOR STUDENTS (13th September 2022)

Students who take admission in our college for the first time are not familiar with the college campus. Therefore, the students are taken around the college campus to show them different facilities of the college which contribute substantially in enhancing their knowledge and simultaneously help in building up their personality. Various sections and facilities provided in the college were shown to the students.

- Interior and exterior of Deekshabhoomi dome.
The guided tour started right from the main gate of Deekshabhoomi. The first thing one notices on entering through the gate is the imposing stupa which is in the shape of a hemispherical dome made of concrete and we take pride in stating that it is the largest dome in Asia. Thereafter the students are taken inside the dome where they can see the magnificent statues of Bhagwan Gautam Buddha and Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, the architect of Constitution of India. The students were informed about the importance of the Deekshabhoomi where Dr. B. R. Ambedkar embraced Buddhism along with millions of his followers.

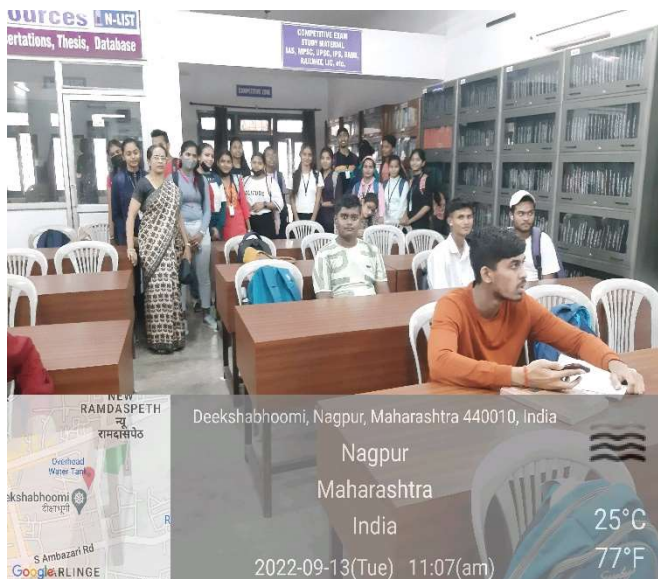

REPORT OF INTERACTION OF EX-STUDENT WITH FIRST YEAR STUDENTS (13th Sept. 2022)

An interaction of our ex-student Ms. Sharvari Tikre who was awarded merit certificate in 12th Statistics Olympiad 2020 conducted by C.R. Rao Advanced Institute of Mathematics, Statistics and Comp.Science was organised with the students of first year in Deeksharambh. She was an all-rounder student of Dept. of Statistics. The programme began with a formal welcome speech by Mrs. A. M. Badar, Head of Dept. Of Statistics. To motivate the students HoD gave information to the present students regarding different best qualities of the Ms. Sharvari like seriousness in studies, sincerity, enthusiastic nature, helping nature, talent in extra-curricular activities, ability to motivate all students of department to participate in activities of the dept. to the first-year students. The program was well attended by students of Statistics. In all 29 students attended the program.

Ms Sharvari told the students that subject Statistics which they have chosen has applications in many fields such as medicine, engineering, finance, transportation, Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Machine Learning etc. She emphasized that to excel in the field of Statistics the students should have sound knowledge of the fundamentals of subject. She also advised the students to learn the use of Statistical software and programming in addition to their course syllabus. She told the students the importance of developing communication skills. She said that better communication gives confidence to the candidate while facing interviews. She also encouraged the students to prepare themselves for going to other institution of repute for higher studies as it will enable them to get better jobs. Ms. Sharvari gave information about different universities like Delhi university, Poona university, Hyderabad university, B.H.U, J.N.U., I.I.T, N.I.T. where admission can be taken for Master in Statistics, Data Science etc. and also about JAM, GATE exams for masters admission, CUET exam for admission to 24 universities. She also informed the students about books, online classes for preparation for master's admission like Unacademic, Ed uncle.

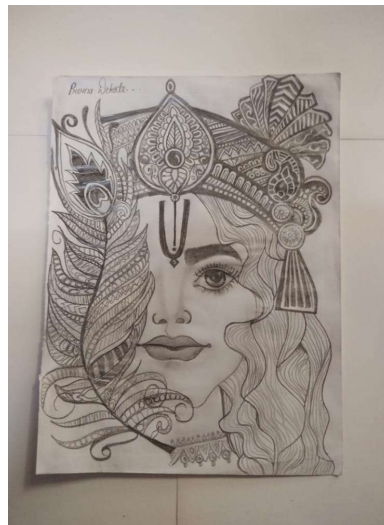

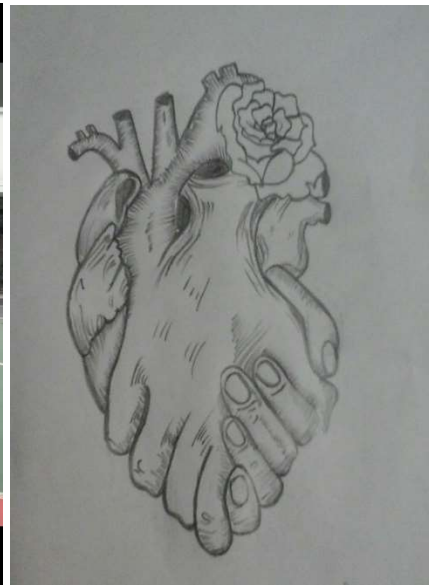

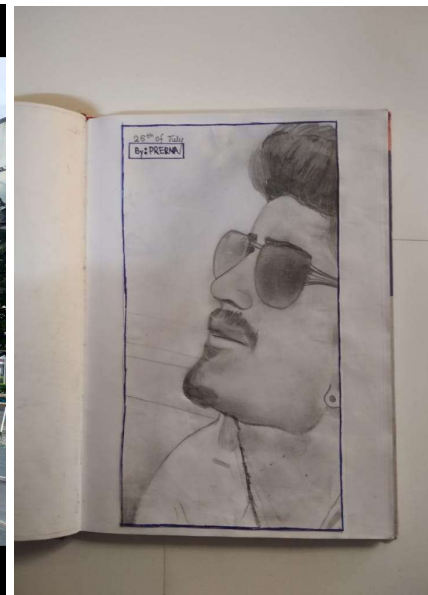
