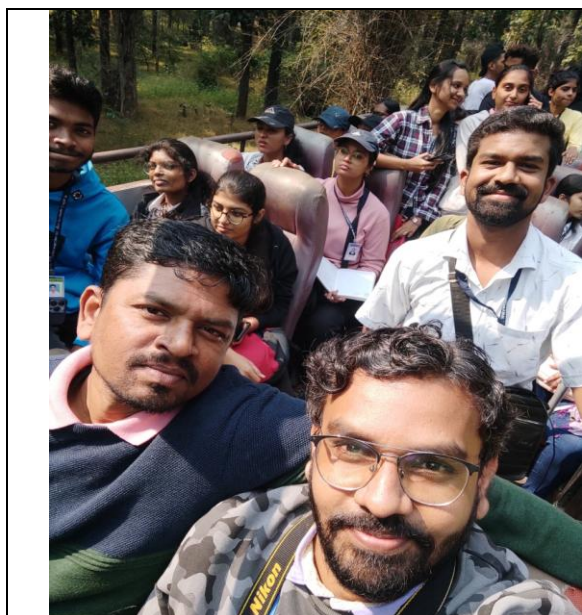

Mogarkasa is 76 kms from Nagpur City in the Paoni range under Nagpur division. It covers an area around 16 sq km and falls in the tourism circuit Ramdham-Ramtek-Nagardhan-Mogarkasa-Pench.

Mogarkasa Reserve Forest is a mixed forest with combination of trees *like teak, ain, tendu, bamboo, haldu, salai, dhawda* etc. The wildlife species in Mogarkasa include leopard, *sloth bear, chital, sambar, wild dogs* and wild life richness and unmatched scenic beauty.
