
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


NOTICE

The HR Cell of the college commenced its HR lecture series of the new academic session 2022-23 by hosting the commencement HR lecture on the 16th July 2022, Saturday. The lecture was organized on the topic “Need for Innovations in Teaching- learning in the current educational scenario”. This topic was chosen for discussion in view of the New Educational Policy (NEP) 2020, which is now sought to be given effect to in the RTM Nagpur University

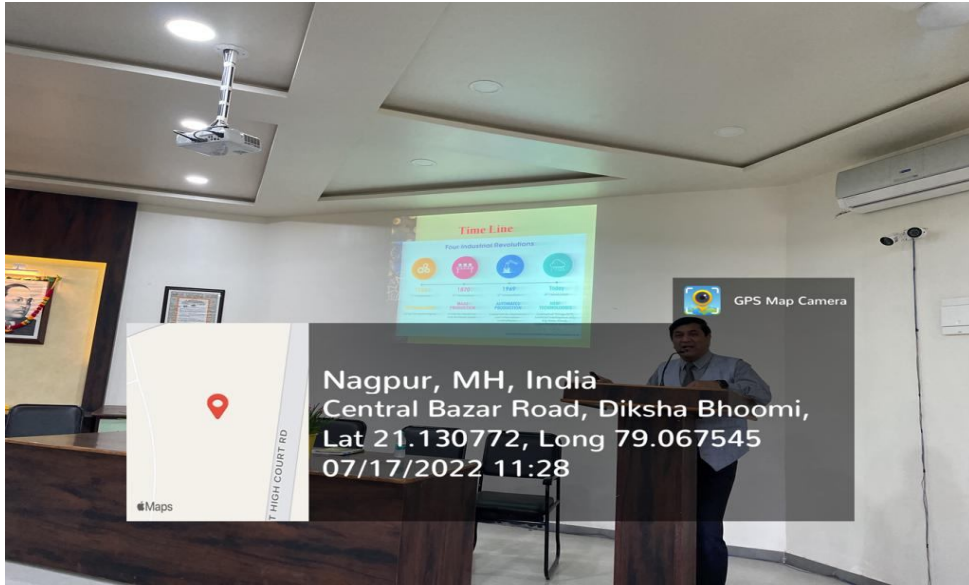
Dr Nanoti began his talk by bringing into discussion the key highlights of the NEP and what exactly does it seek to achieve. He threw vivid light on the inter-disciplinary approach to education which lies at the heart of the policy and the multiple entry-exit scheme which has been suggested therein. He also brought into discussion the importance of skill development in all programmes run by universities. Dr Nanoti, in his effective style brought forth on the minds of teachers the fact that it has become imperative for teachers to bring in innovations in the way they work and engage with students. The overhauling changes in the educational landscape that have been envisaged by the new policy document re-imagines the role of teachers in the new era. He also said that the present age teachers have no option but to get technology friendly and make sure that they use technology, not mechanically, but to upgrade their teaching skills. The examples furnished by Dr Nanoti for bringing home the point that educational institutions must create employable graduates were very apt and amazing.

The operationalization of the NEP, he said, will no doubt have to be done in a phased manner. But he passionately urged the teachers to abandon their resistance against the overhauling changes that are likely in the near future. He also discussed about the autonomy that the government will be insisting that institutions should have. How can educational institutions function with better quality and better output if they get autonomous, was also quite exhaustively discussed by the resource person.

At the end of his capturing talk the forum was thrown open for teachers to ask questions and interact with Dr Nanoti. Teachers engaged into a very interesting interaction and asked several questions to him. Most questions were about the feasibility of working on the NEP, to which Dr Nanoti gave very satisfying answers.

This lecture by Dr Vivek Nanoti marked a great beginning to the HR lecture series of this academic session. It was very well received and appreciated by the teacher-participants.

At the end of the talk the formal vote of thanks was delivered by the Co-ordinator of the HR Cell Dr Varsha V Deshpande.
