POLICE STATION VISIT REPORT

Place of Visit: Bajaj Nagar Police Station, Nagpur.

Date of Visit: 5th March, 2020

Number of students: 100

On entering the police station we were accompanied by the Police Inspector Shri. R.A Kshirsagar, who was kind enough to take out his time and explain to us about the different departments and their working and also walked us throughout, the police station. The police officials spoke to us about how they function and explained to us about the activities undertaken by the police station under their jurisdiction.

Following were the duties to be performed by the police in their respective areas:

Controlling traffic Women protection Maintaining peace and tranquility Maintenance of law and order Arresting the anti-social elements Controlling criminal and suspicious activities Preventing the crime

Physical Observations

1) Reception: On the left hand, as we entered the main building inside the station, there was a reception. It was headed by a lady constable. It is a place from where the complaint is directed to the respective duty officer. No FIR is lodged in this section only the entries are made.

2) Women Help Desk: To make the women feel secured and comfortable, a separate Women Help Desk has been created. A lady constable is present at this help desk which deals with the women who are either complainants or needs some information.

3) Duty Officer: Duty officer is a person who lodges the FIR and tells the respective officer about the report. He maintains the daily diary and files entry in them. In case of cognizable offence, he lodges FIR (First Information report) while an NCR (Non Cognizable Report) is filed in case of non cognizable offences. He also maintains the PCR calls.

4) Record Room: All files are maintained here. The record of various offences and there details, PCR call record, bail register, FIR record and other information are maintained here. The registers are given number and are designated by those numbers.

5) Computer Room: The police station has now become advanced as compared to earlier. All the data and the police records are now saved in a computerized form instead of managing it in files and papers. The computers and other electronic machinery present in the police station should be latest and well-advanced and police officers must be properly trained about their functioning.

6) Police Lock-Up: There are separate lock-ups for male and female. A proper sanitation facility is provided. Rooms have sanitation facilities but no switchboards or fans, nails or any sharp edges which might help them commit suicide or harm themselves in any form.

Around 100 students were part of it along with faculty members Dr. Pratima Lokhande, Ms.Shilpa Rathod and Advocate S.S. Bhoyar. The police station visit exposed the students to acquaint with the structure of the police station and the nature of duties performed by the police officers and their role in the contemporary society with changing trends of crime and criminal tendencies.
