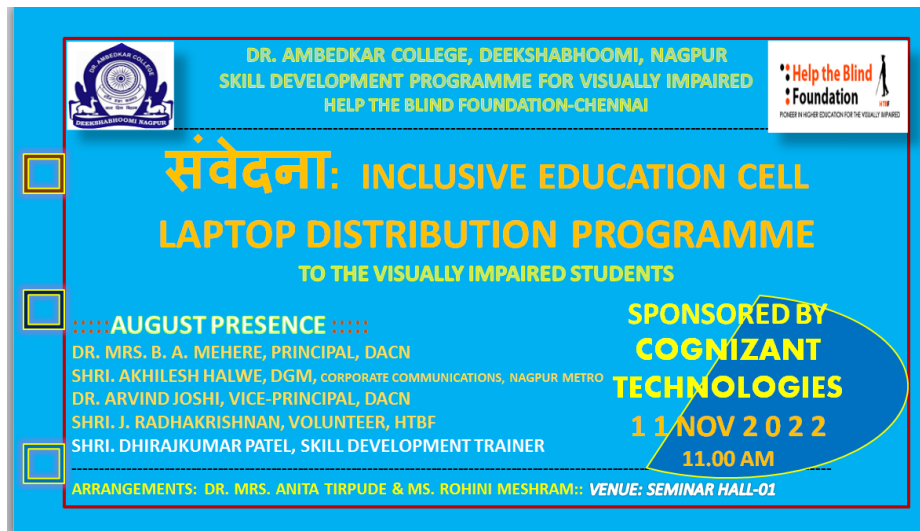


# DR. AMBEDKAR COLLEGE, DEEKSHABHOOMI, NAGPUR PRESS REPORT

## ***'Sanvedana' distributes 19 Special Laptops to Visually Impaired Students***



‘Sanvedna’- The Inclusive Education Cell of Dr. Ambedkar College Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur held a laptop distribution program **(Friday, 11-11-2022)** to the visually impaired students. Laptops were sponsored by Cognizant Technologies, Pune.

The college is running a Training program designed by Help the Blind Foundation, Chennai which was inaugurated earlier by the trustees of HTBF, Chennai.

The training programme named E-MET (Employability, Mobility, Education and Training) aims at providing skills in all walks of life to the visually impaired students in the college which will run till 2024.

The Chief Guest for the program was Shri. Akhilesh Halve, DGM, Corporate Communications, Nagpur Metro, Nagpur. In his address Shri Halve stressed the importance of special services and training to the Divyangs and praised the initiative taken by the college. He said that it should be our prime duty to attend persons with special abilities and provide maximum

opportunities so that they can become a part of mainstream life as well as service sector. He further added that educational institutions are the best places to design and deliver such training modules and Dr. Ambedkar College is doing an exceptional work in this domain. He also gave information about facilities provided by Nagpur Metro for the disabled students.

Mehere, Principal in her presidential speech said that the Inclusive Education Cell will help the students to access and gain equal opportunity in education and learning and the college is committed to provide all possible help to realise the aims and objectives of *Sanvedana* Cell in the college.
