

A Three-Day training program "NAVIGATING THE N.T.A. NET & SET EXAMINATION MAZE: TIPS AND STRATEGIES FOR M.A. ENGLISH STUDENTS" was organized by Department of English, Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur on 22/04/2024 to 24/04/2024 in Room No 212. The program is designed to prepare students for NET/SET examinations by familiarizing them with the exam pattern and syllabus. It also focuses on providing strategies and tips for effective time management during the examination.

Additionally, the program aims to enhance students' understanding of key topics and concepts in English literature, language, and literary theory. The program was conducted by an alumnus of college Mr. Sanghpriy Meshram.
