"Visit to Sitabuldi Fort on Occasion of Republic Day 2024"

On January 26, 2024, a group of students from Dr. Ambedkar College in Nagpur went on an educational visit organised by the college's Yatra Cell. Introducing the students to Sitabuldi Fort's rich historical and cultural legacy was the main goal of the visit. In addition, it sought to promote respect and pride for the history of our country, particularly on Republic Day. The students were astounded by the fort's imposing presence among the city when they arrived. Standing precariously on the twin hills of Badi Tekri and Choti Tekri, Sitabuldi Fort offered an enthralling trip back in time.

We were astounded by the fort's architectural magnificence and strategic design as we descended farther within. The tour included stops at the fort's central courtyard, cannons, and bastions, among other locations. Every segment offered discernments into the military strategies utilised during its establishment and its importance in safeguarding the area. A particularly moving moment during the visit occurred when the students stood in front of the cell where Mahatma Gandhi was briefly imprisoned during the Non-Cooperation Movement in 1920. An effective symbol of the sacrifices made in the struggle for freedom was the cell's stark simplicity. The students' tribute to Mahatma Gandhi's unwavering spirit.

An inspiring war memorial honouring the soldiers who bravely lost their lives in the Anglo-Maratha War is also housed in the fort. The inscription on the memorial served as a stark reminder of the human cost of conflict, prompting students to reflect quietly. The barracks, which are presently occupied by the Indian Territorial Army, was visited as part of the ongoing exploration. The soldiers, with their courteous demeanour, shared fascinating insights into military life, enriching the students' educational experience.

The children were filled with a fresh appreciation for the intricate web of Indian history as they emerged from the fort, bringing with them a wealth of memories. The echoes of battles and the whispers of freedom fighters lingered in the air, imprinting their hearts and minds. Undoubtedly, the trip to Sitabuldi Fort acted as a springboard, encouraging them to learn more about the sources of our country's history.


