

The **Department of Statistics** organized a Guest Lecture / Interactive Session on Career Guidance for students of all the years of B.Sc. on Monday **26-02-2024** at **10:30 AM** in Kumbhare Hall (Main Auditorium).

The session started with seeking blessings of Thathagat Gautam Buddha and Param Pujya Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar.



After felicitation of the guest, Principal Ma'am delivered the Welcome address. The Head of the Department gave formal introduction of Resource person **Shri. Piyush D. Telrandhe**. The resource person Shri. Piyush currently works as an Assistant General Manager (AGM) in RBI and has an impressive profile.

The lecture started with him interacting and explaining basic concepts like what is meant by career, why do we do job or pursue a career etc. He then discussed about different types of job in public and private sector. He gave an idea especially about the numerous job opportunities available in the government sector, insurance sector, actuarial apprentice, banking etc.



He then started giving a brief idea about different types of jobs in government sectors and explained how to pursue exams conducted by RBI, UPSC, MPSC, SSC etc. He discussed how recruitment is done in banks of the public and private sectors and the paper pattern such exams in brief.



He discussed the various departments in RBI and their work and the important role of Statistics therein. He then explained about various exams conducted by RBI for which a graduate is eligible. Specifically, he gave idea of DSIM exam and explained the Role of Statistician in the RBI. He quoted the facilities given by RBI to their employee. He shared his experience working with the RBI and the exposure he got while working there.

He explained how to approach competitive exams, how the recruitment is done, and what qualities one must have to crack these exams. He stated certain points to work upon for the government exams like clarity in thoughts, finding one's weaknesses and strengths, writing a diary, finding about exams one wishes to appear for, time-bound planning, positive friend circle and much more.

He also gave tips about the small things to remember during any interview like the body language to look confident. He discussed personality development during the graduation period which can be done by participating in various competitions and improving communication skills and vocabulary.



His talk concluded after Q & A from the audience.

The session was interactive and informative which helped widen the horizons of students about the opportunities present after graduation and gave ideas about the preparation required for it.
