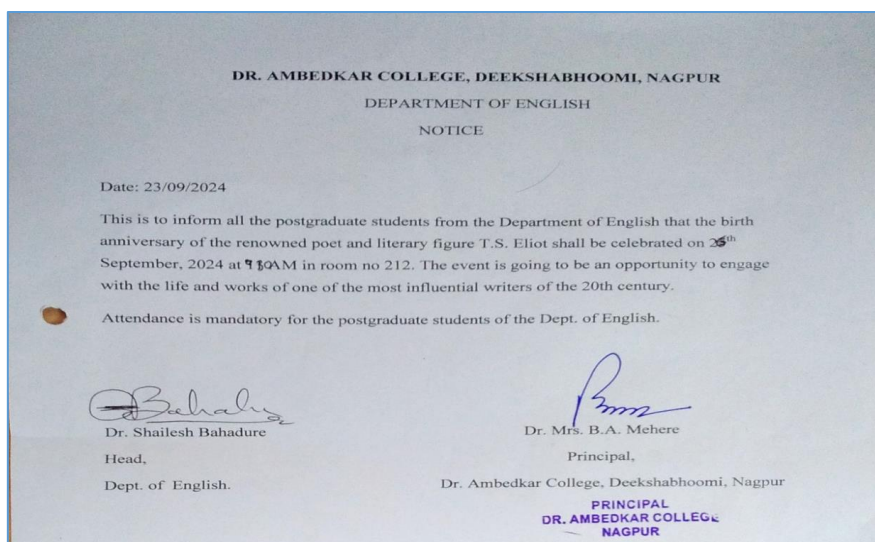

The Department of English of Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur, organized a program on 26th September 2024 at 9.30 AM in Room 212 to celebrate the birth anniversary of the esteemed poet and critic T. S. Eliot. The program was attended by all postgraduate students and faculty members from the Department. Its aim was to honor Eliot's remarkable contributions to modernist poetry and foster a deeper understanding of his influence on literature and provide students with a platform to present their insights and critical analyses of Eliot's works, and inspire them to engage with literary history and criticism in their academic pursuits.
