PayBack to Tribal Womens' at Bhamragad Dist. Gadchiroli (MS) India on 5-6th January 2025

By empowering rural woman through education can thus enable them to live with dignity and self-reliance cutting across the barriers of customary biases and prejudices, social barrier of caste, class, gender, occupation and institutional barriers that prevent them from taking actions to improve their state both at the individual and collective level. Article 14 ensures equality before law. Article 15 prohibits any discrimination. Indian women are the beneficiaries of the constitutional rights. After these rights, position of women has legally strengthened but in practice even today, they are victims of exploitations and atrocities. Tribal society in the post-Independence era has been witness to unprecedented change, which has been most marked in respect of culture, modes of making a living and social. The major communities of tribals those reside in the Bhamragad region are Gond, Madia, Pardhan and Kolam. They have their own languages as "Gondi, Madiya". Traditional tribal women's collect fruits, edible roots, vegetables, tubers, red ants, ethnomedicine, veterinary medicine, firewood and manage household affairs. Some tribal womens look after harvesting, transplanting the agri-produce. In terms of health, education, decision making and political participation the tribal women are mostly found to be lagging behind their men counterparts.
