Deekshabhoomi, located in Nagpur, Maharashtra, is a sacred monument of Buddhism and a significant historical site. It marks the place where Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, along with thousands of followers, embraced Buddhism on **14th October 1956**, initiating the mass conversion movement for social equality and human rights. With reference to the letter received from Joint Directorate of Nagpur division (Ref. Ushinbag/Ashta/sankirn/1515/2025). Department of Chemistry, Physics and Botany has organized a visit of MSc, PhD students of Chemistry and Physics department. An educational visit was organized for students to learn about the historical, cultural, and social significance of Deekshabhoomi, promoting awareness about Dr. Ambedkar's teachings and Buddhist philosophy.

Objective of the program

- To understand the historical importance of Deekshabhoomi.
- To learn about Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's role in social reform and the Dalit Buddhist movement.
- To explore Buddhist architecture and teachings.
- To promote values of equality, peace, and social justice among students.

A. Arrival and Welcome

- The students arrived at Deekshabhoomi in the morning and were welcomed by the site guides. A brief introduction was given about the significance of the place.

B. Exploration of the Stupa

- The **Deekshabhoomi Stupa**, a magnificent structure, was the main attraction.

- Students observed the **marble-carved panels** depicting the life of Lord Buddha and Dr. Ambedkar's journey.
- The **sacred Bodhi tree**, planted near the stupa, was explained as a symbol of enlightenment.

C. Visit to the Museum and Library

- The on-site **museum** displayed artifacts, photographs, and documents related to Dr. Ambedkar and the Buddhist movement.
- The **library** contained books on Buddhism, social justice, and constitutional rights.


D. Interactive Session






