*To commemorate the birth anniversary of the renowned English Romantic poet **Percy Bysshe Shelley**, a **Poetry Recitation Competition** was organized in our college/ classroom on **4th August 2025**. *The program commenced with a brief introduction to Shelley's life and works, highlighting his contributions to English literature, especially his themes of idealism, liberty, and the power of imagination. Students were informed about Shelley's prominent poems such as *Ode to the West Wind*, *To a Skylark*, and *Ozymandias*, which continue to inspire readers worldwide.*

The introductory remarks were made by Dr. Shailesh Bahadure, subject teacher for the ELT classroom. He explained students background of the writer and the era where his poetic creativity flourished. It was followed by poetry recitation by students.
