
NOTICE

All the students of BA.LLB V semester 5 years are hereby informed that a compulsory subject of "Court Visit" is a part of skill-based subject as proposed through NEP (National Education Policy). Under this course the students are required to witness the original proceedings before the courts and different roles assigned to Court officers. They are required to observe the day-to-day functioning of the courts like how proceedings are conducted. As per the syllabus, the students are also expected to understand the filing procedures and hence visit to Civil and Criminal filing section of High court is essential. In pursuance to this, it is mandatory for the students to visit the courts and note down the observations and write in their court visit diary. Accordingly a court visit is scheduled as per the following dates.

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Department of Law is always instrumental in providing and facilitating quality educational and practical skills to the law students. As per the New Educational policy, Court visits is one of the important factor of skill based education. Such visits are essential for law students as they provide a practical, real-world perspective that complements theoretical legal education, offering insights into courtroom dynamics, the roles of legal professionals, and the practical application of laws. Court visits bridge the gap between classroom learning and the practical application of law, helping students see how legal principles are implemented in real-life situations. Taking into consideration the importance of court visits, the visits to major courts in Nagpur district were scheduled in the month of September after taking official permission from the respective court authorities.

Day 1: 16th September 2025- Visit to Labour and Industrial Court, Nagpur.

On this day, the students of BA.LLB 5 years course were taken to Labour and Industrial Court by the Co-ordinating faculty members. During this visit students understood the difference between Labour and Industrial court, its functioning, composition and the numerous statutes and schedules by which each court is governed. The alumni of the Department of Law, Adv. Vrushali Dharamshahare and Adv. Akshay Wankhede practicing as an Advocate in Industrial court guided the students about the working of both courts and also discussed 3-4 cases of Wages Act, Industrial Disputes Act and Factories Act. The Presiding Officer of Labour Court Hon'ble Judge Mr. Padwad also had an interaction with the students. Through this visit students gained the firsthand knowledge about the working of the Labour and Industrial Court.

Day 2: 17th September 2025- Visit to Bombay High Court, Nagpur Bench, Nagpur.

The second day Visit to Bombay High Court was an amazing experience for the law students. Student were very excited to see the well-maintained infrastructure built during British period of Bombay High Court. With sincere efforts and permission by the Sitting Chief Justice Hon'ble Justice Kilor, and the Registrar(Administration) Shri Bhushan P. Kshirsagar and Deputy Registrar Shri A.K. Awari, the visit was a successful one. The visit for a day was divided into different segments. The law students were first taken to Filing sections- Civil, Criminal and Writ, where the officials explained them the nature of cases filed and registered with them. They also updated the students about the importance as well as lacunae of E-filing. After this the students were diverted to Judges Library, wherein the Librarian Mrs.....explained the difference between regular library and the important aspects of Judges library. Further the students were divided into small groups and were allowed to sit in Court Rooms, wherein they got the opportunity to see the actual working of courts where Lawyers were arguing before the Single or Division Bench dealing with different matters. In later part an interaction session was scheduled with the Registrar, Mr. Shirsagar in High Court Auditorium. In this session students clarified certain queries which were answered by the Registrar to their satisfaction.

Day 3: 18th September 2025- Visit to Civil courts, Criminal Courts, Family courts and other courts under District Court.

During this third day visit to District Court of Nagpur, students witnessed the original proceedings before the courts and different roles assigned to Court officers. They observed the functioning of different courts like Family court, Motor Vehicle Tribunals, Rent Control tribunal and how civil proceedings and criminal proceedings etc. are conducted in Sessions courts and JMFC. The students were also taken to filing sections wherein they understood about territorial and pecuniary jurisdiction relating to filing and registration of cases. Lastly the students were divided into groups

and were asked to sit and observe the proceedings going on in different courtrooms, wherein the students observed the decorum of the court and noted down certain cases.

Thus, such Visits provided firsthand experience with courtroom proceedings, judicial behaviour, and the pressure of a live legal environment, something that cannot be replicated in a classroom. Students learnt about the specific roles of judges, prosecutors, and defense lawyers, and how cases progress through the legal system. Witnessing and participating in courtroom scenarios helped in building the student's confidence and familiarity with the environment, which is valuable for their future legal practice. All three days court visit was accompanied by the CHB Faculty Mr. Akash Mohurley and Mr. Paritosh Chandrakapure along with the subject teacher in charge Dr. Mrs. Vaishali A. Sukhdeve.
