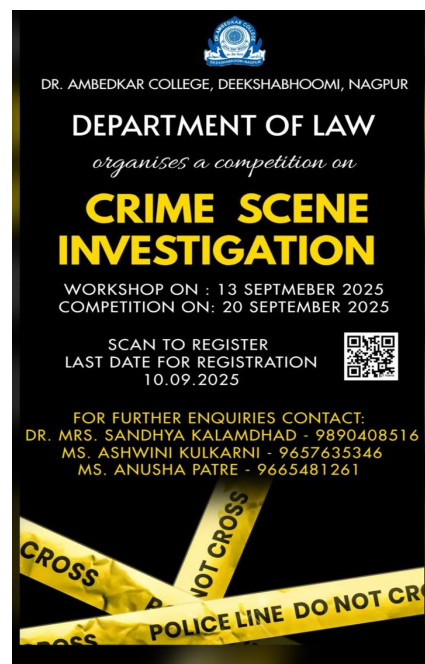
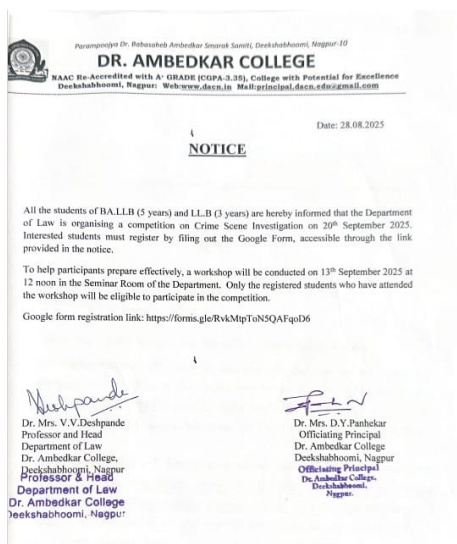

The Department of Law, Dr. Ambedkar College, Deekshabhoomi, Nagpur, in collaboration with Code F Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Nagpur, successfully organized the Final Round of the Crime Scene Investigation Competition on 20th September 2025. This event was a culmination of the Crime Scene Investigation Workshop Series, aimed at providing law students with practical exposure to forensic science and its role in the criminal justice system.

The competition comprised of three crime scenes. First, dowry death scene, second was honour killing scene and third was sexual assault scene. The judges of the competition were Adv. Kritika Shekhar, Adv. Vishwajeet Uberoi, Adv. Vivek Awchat, Ms. Sharon Gautam,

Ms. Shubhangi Nikhare and Ms. Trisha Dey. In the final competition, shortlisted teams were presented with a simulated crime scene, designed to test their investigative, analytical, and teamwork skills. Participants were required to:

- 1. Secure and document the crime scene using standard forensic protocols.**
- 2. Identify, collect, and preserve physical and biological evidence such as fingerprints, blood samples, and fibers.**
- 3. Analyze digital and trace evidence using forensic tools.**
- 4. Prepare a detailed crime scene report and present their findings before the panel of experts.**

Each team demonstrated impressive coordination and application of the techniques learned during the workshop sessions. The judges evaluated the participants on parameters such as accuracy of evidence collection, methodology, report presentation, and clarity of reasoning behind their conclusions. The competition provided an engaging platform for students to apply theoretical legal knowledge to realistic forensic problem-solving scenarios. It encouraged critical thinking, attention to detail, and a scientific approach to criminal investigation — essential qualities for aspiring legal professionals.

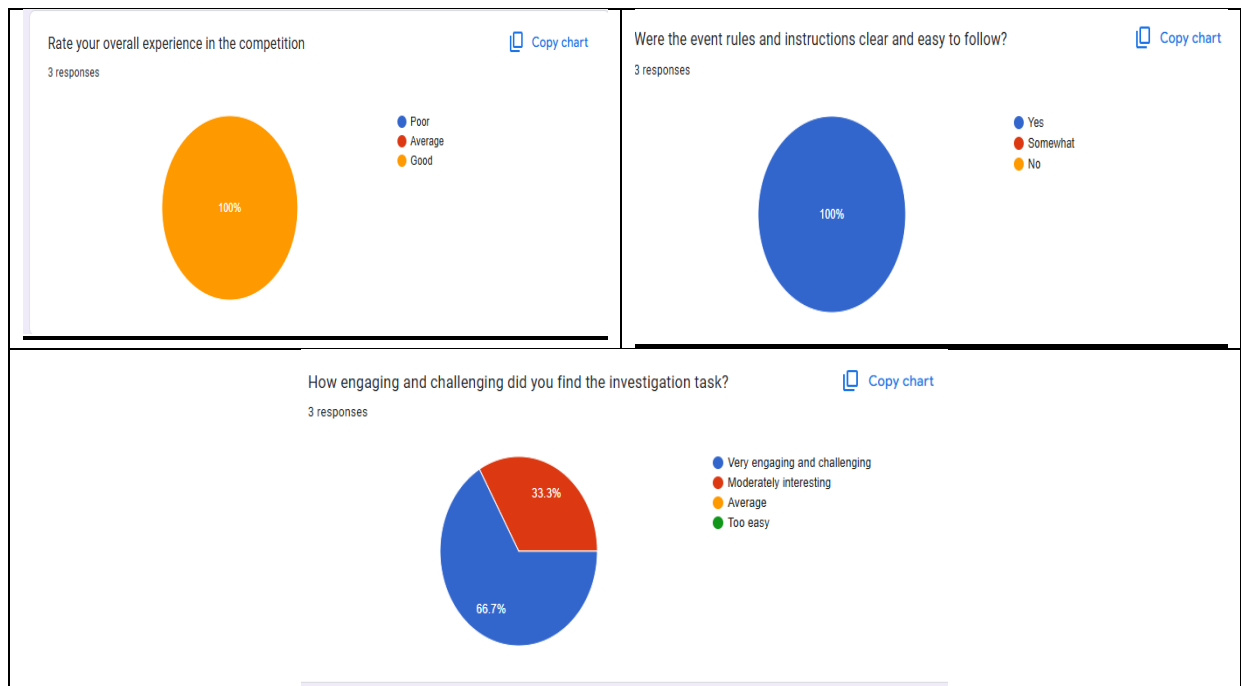
